

## POVERTY POINT ROAD DRAINAGE AND SURFACE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

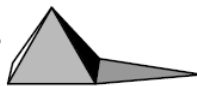


Poverty Point Road is surrounded by fields and is at a low point in topography. Stormwater was trapped in the road corridor, compromising the road surface. In order to address these stormwater issues, existing culverts were replaced, new culverts were installed and approximately 500-feet of underdrain was constructed. The existing asphalt surface road on Poverty Point Road in Wilmington Township was milled and a specialized Driving Surface Aggregate (DSA) was placed as part of this Lawrence County Conservation District Dirt and Gravel Road Program.

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### PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- Funding through Penn State Center for Dirt, Gravel and Low Volume Road Grant
- Replacement and New Installation of 15" , 18" and 36" Culverts
- Headwall and End wall Construction
- Installation of over 500-feet of 6" Underdrain
- Placement of Driving Surface Aggregate to Convert an Existing Paved road to "Unpaved"
